1. Look at the theme verse **Romans 15:13**, “May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace as you trust in him, so that you may **overflow with hope by the power of the Holy Spirit.**” Jesus speaks of overflow in **Matthew 12:34**, “For out of the overflow of the heart the mouth speaks.” How can spoken words cause you to overflow with hope?

The Words You Speak

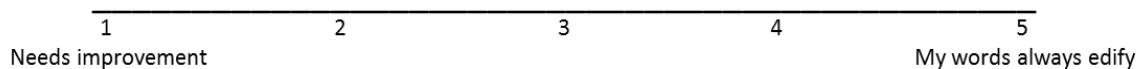
2. If you are filling up a vase with water and it overflows, what happens? Water splashes out and gets everything around it wet. I have a friend who gets so excited with the things God is showing her that she just naturally uses her words to tell others. Her excitement is contagious as she is talking, the tempo of her speech quickens, her hands gesture and I find myself being excited right along with her. It has become sort of an inside joke between her and several of our friends that when we are excited about what God is showing us we will say, “You’re really splashing today.” **Psalm 119:171-172** says, “May my lips overflow with praise, for you teach me your decrees. May my tongue sing of your word, for all your commands are righteous.” Based on what God is doing in your life, how can your lips overflowing with praise?

3. According to The Bible in One Year website, “If you include scientific words, there are over 1,000,000 words in the English language. Women speak about 16,000 words a day on average. Your words matter. However, what matters most is not the number of words you speak but the kind of words you choose and the purpose for which you use them.”

Perhaps like me you know a few women who really edify others with the words they choose. They live out **Ephesians 4:29**, “Do not let any unwholesome talk come out of your mouths, but only what is helpful for building others up according to their needs, that it may benefit those who listen.” Every time I talk with them I leave feeling encouraged and filled with hope.

For me, however, this is a more of a work in progress; I need to remind myself that my words matter. The apostle James tells us that although “the tongue is a small part of the body” it is extremely powerful (**James 3:5**) and “*The tongue has the power of life and death.*” (**Proverbs 18:21a**)

The Words God Speaks

6. The words God speaks matter and should especially make a difference in the way we view ourselves. God spoke the world into being by the power of His words (Hebrews 11:3). Let that sink in, by the power of His words, He spoke the world into existence. The words God speaks about you and me are just as powerful. Look at a few examples of these in the statements below. Read them out loud slowly. Let the words God has spoken about you sink in. Circle the ones that are particularly meaningful to you today.

I am His daughter. (Ephesians 1:5; John 1:12)

I have been set free in Christ. (Galatians 5:1)

I am God’s handiwork. (Ephesians 2:10)

The Words You Speak To God

8. We see that the words we speak “**horizontality**” to others have power. There are other words we speak that have power and they are words we speak to God “**vertically**” through prayer. Just like we want our children to communicate with us and tell us their thoughts, concerns, desires and joy, our heavenly Father desires the same from His daughters. Of course as Christians we all know we are supposed to do it. But ask yourself this, has prayer become the rhythm of your life, has it become the air you breathe, and has it become the culture of your home, of your family, of your personal life? Does prayer feel to you like pure duty or is it the delight of your heart?

God delights in your prayer (**Proverbs 15:8**), he desires for us to, “Devote yourselves to prayer, being watchful and thankful” (**Colossians 4:2**) and to, “Be joyful in hope, patient in affliction, faithful in prayer” (**Romans 12:12**). Prayer is meant to be an ongoing dialogue with the Lord. **First Thessalonians 5:17** notes believers are to, “pray without ceasing” or without end. Just like with a friend, the more we talk with God in prayer the more comfortable we become. The disciples saw Jesus live this out as our perfect example and it prompted them to ask a question of Him.

Read Luke 11:1-13.

What did the disciples ask Jesus in verse 1?

What does the story in verses 5-8 say about persistence in prayer?

What do verses 9-10 say about the results of prayer?

What do verses 11-13 say about God and what he desires to do for you?
